1. INTRODUCTION

This document contains the general selection principles and the dates of selection events, which the CFF will use to select the team for the 2007 Junior and Cadet World Championships. This information will allow athletes and coaches to develop their annual training and competition plans for the season.

While every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the material contained within this document, readers are advised to consult with the High Performance Director, if they have questions about any elements contained within.

Similarly, the competition dates are accurate as of the date of publication, but dates and events can and do change. Please verify competition details before making final travel arrangements.

Due to the nature of the international competition schedule and other unforeseeable problems, this document should be considered a guideline. The CFF has taken every possible step to ensure that this material will remain accurate for the entire season, but in instances where changes do occur, specifically to pre-designated selection competitions, up-to-date copies of these changes can be found on the CFF Web Page.

2. KEY CHANGES FROM 2005-2006

- 1) **The domestic component of the Selection Rankings** will now include the competitions from the higher age group, increasing the number of domestic competitions to six (6). For the Junior Rankings, Junior and Senior CSC/Nationals will be considered, whereas for the Cadet Rankings, Cadet and Junior CSC/Nationals will be considered. The best 5 (of 6) results will count for the domestic component. However, due to the timing of this change (after the 2006 Nationals) for 06-07 the Senior event will not count for the Junior rankings and the Junior event will not count for the Cadet Rankings. Therefore for 06-07, the best 4 of 5 results will count for the selection rankings.
- 2) **Junior/Cadet Point grid:** Minor adjustments have been made to award a CT result for a top 16 result in CDEV and a top 32 result in JDEV. The strength factor will now be calculated based on fencers ranked in the top 64 on the world rankings (no ties).
- 3) **Athlete ID:** The CT Athlete ID standard has been changed and now requires cadets to reproduce performances during the season. Two CT results (instead of one) are now required.
- 4) **Selection Criteria:** To be selected for the Jr or Cd World Championships a fencer **must** meet the minimum standard **or** be ranked first in respective weapon/age group.

3. ELIGIBILITY FOR SELECTIONS

To be eligible for selection for the Junior/Cadet World Championships a fencer must:

- 1) be a member of the CFF;
- 2) have a valid FIE license; and
- 3) be selected by the HPP Selection Committee.

4. HP SELECTION COMMITTEE

The HP Selection Committee will make the final selections for the 2007 Junior/Cadet World Championships. It will consist of:

- 1) the HP Director,
- 2) the V-P High Performance,
- 3) the National Coaches, and
- 4) an athletes representative named by the Athletes Council.

The Selection Committee reserves the right to withdraw an athlete from a selection:

1. **If the athlete has not taken part in the mandatory training camps organised by the CFF prior to the event.**
2. **If the athlete has not fulfilled his/her responsibilities as identified in the “HPP Athletes Agreement”.**
3. **If the athlete has not fulfilled his/her responsibilities as identified in the “CFF Code of Conduct”.**

5. CADET/JUNIOR/DIV I AND II NAC’S

NAC’s organized by the USFA will often be designated as international selection competitions for the HPP Selection Rankings. Please refer to page 12 for a complete list.

There are no selection criteria to compete in Cadet and Junior NAC’s. All cadet and junior fencers are strongly encouraged to take part in any DIV II competition that may be held the same weekend as a Cadet or Junior NAC. The USFA does not allow a fencer with a C rating or higher to compete in DIV II competition. This is a terrific developmental opportunity for our fencers to accumulate additional competition experience and learn to win.

The USFA does impose a minimum standard for DIV I NA’Cs. They require that a fencer have a C rating or higher to register. Since our two systems are different, the CFF has negotiated a policy with the USFA whereby (in each weapon) the CFF will award temporary C rating to all Junior fencers ranked in the top 8 and all Cadet fencers ranked in the top 4 on the respective HPP ranking (on the registration date of any DIV I NAC).

Fencers are responsible for their own registration and travel arrangements to these competitions. Please confirm all dates, locations and registration deadlines before booking flights for NAC events on the USFA web site (www.usfencing.org).

6. JUNIOR WORLD CUPS IN CANADA

This World Cup is open to any junior fencer registered as a CFF competitive member. All fencers must register individually with the organizing committee and must purchase a FIE license on the CFF web site before December 15, 2006. **This competition is the final selection event for the Cadet and Junior World Championships.**

7. JUNIOR WORLD CUPS OUTSIDE OF CANADA

Although these competitions do not count for selection purposes they do serve an important developmental role. Some fencers may be at the level to take part in additional Junior World Cups to prepare for the Worlds and gain valuable international experience.

To be eligible to compete in a Junior World Cup held outside of Canada/USA, a fencer must be identified as “JB” (or higher) **30 days prior to the competition.** The CFF will only select 4 fencers for any junior world cup held outside of Canada. The HP Director will allocate these spots in the following manner:

1. By using the final 2005-2006 Junior Selection Rankings, for a Junior World Cup held prior to December 31, 2006.
2. By using the most recent 2006-2007 Junior Selection Rankings, for a Junior World Cup held after January 1, 2007.

A fencer who wishes to take part in a Junior World Cup must confirm his/her participation in writing, preferably by e-mail at wcreg@fencing.ca at least 30 days prior to the event. Should a fencer not register in writing by the deadline he/she will not be registered for that Junior World Cup.

8. OTHER DEVELOPMENTAL COMPETITIONS

There is final group of competitions in Germany and France, which are also important to an athlete’s development. Due to their format and size they are a much better investment than Junior World Cups. Information on these circuits can be found at:

Personal/Provincial Coaches are encouraged to plan a club/provincial team trip to one of the Cadet or Junior competitions held in these countries as a developmental tour (competition and training in clubs). In some cases it may be more beneficial for several clubs and or provinces to get together to resource such a project. The HPD can assist in identifying and establishing contacts for such a project.

FOR ALL COMPETITIONS IN LISTED IN CHAPTERS 5-8, THE CFF DOES NOT SEND ANY COACHES OR SUPPORT PERSONNEL. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT ALL MINORS TRAVEL WITH AN ADULT (PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR CLUB/PROVINCIAL COACH).

9. 2007 CADET AND JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Date:	April 8-16, 2007
Location:	Izmir, Turkey
Qualification period:	April 1, 2006 to the selection date
Selection date:	January 22, 2007
Minimum standard:	Cadets - CT Juniors - JB

In order to confirm a selection, a fencer must:

- a) Be registered in the CFF HPP (If not already registered, a selected fencer will be invited to join the HPP and must submit all required documentation by February 10, 2007);
- b) Participate in the mandatory training camp (HPP Selection Camp);
- c) Have a valid FIE license;
- d) Travel to Turkey with the team as organized by the CFF; and
- e) Stay with the team at the designated hotel for the entire World Championships.

MANDATORY TRAINING CAMPS

The HPP Selection Camp is **mandatory** for all Junior and Cadet fencers in order to confirm their selection for the 2007 Cadet/Junior World Championships. It is a four or five day camp, with a very heavy emphasis on fencing competitive bouts. It will likely be held in February or March at the Montreal NTC, but the date and location are still to be confirmed. Please refer to the 06-07 HPP Selection Criteria when they will be published in November 2006.

Any fencer who does not attend this camp will have their selection revoked by the Selection Committee. Details of the camp will be posted on the CFF web site once the team has been selected.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Any junior criteria identified below must be achieved during the qualification period. For each event, the selection committee will select team members using the respective age group HPP Selection Rankings on January 22nd, 2007 as follows:

FUNDING

Due to current low funding levels from Sport Canada for 06-07, it is most probable that there will be **no funding** available to athletes for this event. All selected athletes will be responsible for the full cost of taking part in this event (estimated to be \$2500 to \$3000). Should any funds become available they will be distributed to those athletes who perform at the 2007 Jr Worlds.

A. Cadet individual events

- I. First, any cadet fencer who has been selected for a junior individual event will be selected for the same cadet event.**
- II. Second, fencers who have met the “CT” standard will be selected.** If more than three fencers have qualified by I and II, the selection among CT fencers will be made using the “Cadet Selection Rankings”.
- III. If no one has met the “CT” standard, only one fencer will be selected - the fencer who is ranked first on the “Cadet Selection Rankings”.**

B. Junior individual events

- I. First, any junior fencer who was selected for the 2006 World Championships in Turin and who met the senior “B” standard in 05-06, will be pre-selected for the same junior event.** This selection is conditional on the athlete:
 - 1) registering in the CFF HPP by the December deadline;
 - 2) competing (except for injury) in the Junior and Senior events at both CSC’s in 2006; and
 - 3) taking part (except for injury) in all Sr. National Team Training Camps and Sr. International Selection Competitions prior to the Junior Worlds.This pre-selection will be made after Turin and will be reconfirmed by the HP Selection Committee on the selection date provided that the athlete has respected the above conditions. Should any fencers not respect all of the conditions stated above, they must qualify in the same manner as all other junior fencers starting with point II below.
- II. Second, fencers who have met the “JB” standard will be selected.** If more than three fencers have qualified by I and II, the selection among these (JHP/JA/JB) fencers will be made using the “Junior Selection Rankings”.
- III. If no one has met the “JB” standard, only one fencer will be selected - the fencer who is ranked first on the “Junior Selection Rankings”.**
- IV. If less than 3 fencers qualify for any of the junior events, the highest ranked fencer(s) on the “Cadet Selection Rankings” who has been selected for the same cadet event will be selected to take part in the junior event to gain additional international experience.**

C. Team Event

Should three fencers be selected for a junior event, the CFF will enter a team in that weapon. The three fencers who competed in the junior event will be selected automatically. The National coach will have the option of selecting the 4th team member from either:

- 1) the Junior fencer ranked 4th in the same event on the Junior Selection Rankings, provided that he/she has met the “JA” criteria and is willing to go to the Worlds for the team event only, or
- 2) a cadet fencer after the individual competitions at the World Championships. This will allow the coach to select the alternate after evaluating their performance in the individual event.

The National Coach will also have the authority to remove a fencer from the team should a fencer not follow the program (training and observation) that has been set up by the National Coach prior to the team event at the Junior/Cadet World Championships.

10. ATHLETE ID STANDARDS

The Athlete ID standards form the basis of all CFF selections (National Teams, World Cups, CFF funding opportunities and Sport Canada AAP support). These standards can only be achieved by obtaining specific results in designated international selection competitions during the qualification period for the respective age categories.

When fencers compete in designated international competitions, their result will also be considered for the Athlete ID standards. The point grid on page 10 indicates the junior/cadet ID standard that will be awarded for the corresponding result (depending on the strength of the competition).

The various Junior/Cadet Athlete ID categories and the results required to achieve the various standards are as follows:

Junior HP (JHP): Two JHP results in designated junior international selection competitions

Junior A (JA): Two JA results in designated junior international selection competitions

Junior B (JB): Two JB results in designated junior international selection competitions

Cadet Team (CT): Two CT results in a designated cadet international selection competition

Any fencers that have met the JA/JHP standard **may** be eligible for Athlete Assistance Program (AAP) from Sport Canada for 07-08. Achieving the standard does not guarantee AAP support, since Sport Canada only provides a limited number of cards to the CFF each season. Please refer to the AAP Criteria when they will be published in November.

11. JUNIOR/CADET POINT GRIDS

The following point grid will be used to award selection points for the CSC/Nationals:

NOTES

- The strength of a competition will be determined by taking into consideration the total number of fencers present who are ranked in the top 64 of the Junior FIE World Rankings the day after the competition.

➤	> 24	=	JWC
➤	13 - 24	=	JINT
➤	4 - 12	=	JDEV

- In order to earn points and Athlete ID criteria in designated international competitions a fencer must place in the DE bracket (4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 96) in which 40% of the competitive field has placed. For example:

Jr WC with	99 entries	X 40% = 40	Top 64 earn points and ID standard
Jr INT with	39 entries	X 40% = 16	Top 16 earn points and ID standard
Jr DEV with	78 entries	X 40% = 31	Top 32 earn points and ID standard

- The strength of each designated international selection competition will be pre-set at the beginning of the season. Should a designated competition's calculated strength be greater than the pre-set category, the higher category will prevail.

12. JUNIOR/CADET SELECTION RANKINGS

The Junior/Cadet Selection Rankings will be used to rank athletes for all HPP selections.

Overview: Athletes will be ranked first by the Athlete ID standard that they have achieved during the selection period, then by the total number of selection points. The order of priority for the Athlete ID standards is:

- 1) HP/A/B and selected for the 2006 Sr Worlds.
- 2) JHP
- 3) JA
- 4) JB
- 5) CT (for Cadet rankings only)

The Rankings will be compiled starting with the National Championships. Fencers will be ranked within each age group for selection purposes by the point total of a + b as follows:

Tie-breaking

Should two or more fencers be tied with the same point total, the tie will be broken:

- 1) by the point total of the international component in the Selection Rankings. Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken,
- 2) by the best international result by point total among the pre-designated international selection competitions. Should a tie still exist the, tie will be broken,
- 3) by the best result (by placing) at the most recent international selection competition. Should a tie still exist the, tie will be broken,
- 4) by the best result (by placing) at the most recent Canadian competition.

Updates

In each weapon, the HPP Selection Ranking will be updated on the CFF web site after:

- 1) CSC#1
- 2) CSC#2; and
- 3) any designated international selection competition.
